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Project Description:

This Project's Scope of Work shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

The renovation of the existing Shafer Hall from academic spaces to a residence hall and includes all ancillary/support spaces. The structure is 1946, three story, (approx) 70,000 gsf brick veneer building at the south edge of campus. The structure is assumed to be exterior masonry bearing walls, with cast in place concrete rib slabs on steel framing (except at corridors). The building connects to Burr Hall to the north and is serviced by the adjacent power plant.

This Renovation Project's Scope of Work shall include but not be limited to the following:

- Hazardous Material(s) abatement;
- Sitework modifications to slopes, retaining walls, parking areas, sidewalks, hardscape and landscape;
- Utility connection to existing power plant (or other services) as required;

The CA Construction Scheduler must possess demonstrated proficiency in CPM schedule methodology and utilization of the current version of Primavera Project Planner software and Microsoft Project. The CA Construction Scheduler is required to attend meetings pertaining to scheduling and progress of the work including all progress meetings.

The CA Construction Scheduler shall have at least five (5) years of verifiable experience as the person primarily responsible for preparing and maintaining detailed project schedules on projects of the same or similar size and nature as this project.

The Selected Construction Administrator's (CA) shall provide the services of a Commissioning Agent (CxA).

Commissioning Agent (CxA):

- The CxA is an entity identified by the Owner who leads, plans, schedules, and coordinates the commissioning team to implement the Commissioning (Cx) Process.
- The CxA shall be certified as a commissioning agent by the Building Commissioning Association or the Association of Energy Engineers, and shall be a Professional Engineer registered in the State of Connecticut.
- Commissioning (Cx) shall be performed by an independent third-party CxA who shall not be an employee of the architectural, engineering, or construction firm that implements the project, and shall be hired directly by the Owner through the CA.
