

EXHIBIT A

DESCRIPTION OF GOODS & SERVICES AND ADDITIONAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

1. DESCRIPTION OF GOODS AND SERVICES:

A. Current model year Harley Davidson Road King Police with Specifications

1. Color:

Vivid black to include gas tank, saddlebags (2), front and rear fenders

2. Striping

Gold and bright blue pin striping on gas tank, top and sides of both saddlebags and on the front and rear fenders

B. Additional Equipment:

3. Lights:

- 3.1. Two blue identification lights (Truck-Lite #10a) installed on a plate mounted with the license plate. The lights must be mounted on each side of the license plate and connected with the tail light circuit.
- 3.2. Two forward facing "Whelen" par 36 front LED pursuit lamps (one red/one blue)
- 3.3. Two rear facing "Whelen" 400 Series LED emergency warning lights (one red/one blue) with a chrome swivel mount pedestal
- 3.4. Each side of the motorcycle must be equipped with two separate side facing "Whelen" LINZ6 LED emergency warning lights (red/blue split), with chrome mounting flanges. The lights must be mounted on each side of the motorcycle directly under the radio box and on the front forks.

4. Siren:

One "Whelen" WS-320-H, 100 watt RMS siren system with a SA-350MH siren speaker

5. Manuals:

One copy of the service manual covering all components.

6. Keys:

Three sets of keys are to be provided at the time of delivery.

7. Windshield Markings:

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“STATE POLICE” in gold reflective lettering 2 ¼ inches high by 1 ¾ inches wide, marking must have a black backing, 3 ½ inches wide, running the length of the inscription on the inside of the windshield. The gold reflective lettering must be located on the outside of the windshield, visible from the front, directly above the windshield cross bar.

C. Delivery Requirements

1. The Contractor shall deliver vehicles (the “Vehicles”) in accordance with the terms of this Exhibit A and Exhibit B. The Vehicles must have and meet the following features and requirements:

- 1.1. Be new and of the current model year as of the date of delivery;
- 1.2. Include manufacturers’ standard equipment;
- 1.3. Conform to all applicable federal and state statutes, regulations, ordinances and codes pertaining to the operation and safety of motor vehicles;
- 1.4. Include all applicable guards, warnings and warning labels as required by law;
- 1.5. Be delivered clean, and ready for immediate service;
- 1.6. Be delivered with a full tank of fuel;
- 1.7. Be free of dealer signs and emblems;
- 1.8. Include a certificate of origin corresponding with the information on the purchase order related to the purchase of the Vehicle.

2. ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

(a) Contract Separately/Additional Savings Opportunities

DAS reserves the right to either seek additional discounts from the Contractor or to contract separately for a single purchase, if in the judgment of DAS, the quantity required is sufficiently large, to enable the State to realize a cost savings, over and above the prices set forth in Exhibit B, whether or not such a savings actually occurs.

(b) Mandatory Extension to State Entities

Contractor shall offer and extend the Contract (including pricing, terms and conditions) to political subdivisions of the State (which includes towns and municipalities), schools, and not-for-profit organizations.

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(c) Subcontractors

DAS must approve any and all subcontractors utilized by the Contractor in writing prior to any such subcontractor commencing any work. Contractor acknowledges that any work provided under the Contract to any state entity is work conducted on behalf of the State and that the Commissioner of DAS or his/her designee may communicate directly with any subcontractor as the State deems to be necessary or appropriate. Contractor shall be responsible for all payment or fees charged by the subcontractor(s). A performance evaluation of any subcontractor shall be provided promptly by the Contractor to DAS upon request.

Contractor must provide the majority of services described in the specifications.

(d) Security and/or Property Entrance Policies and Procedures

Contractor shall adhere to established security or property entrance policies and procedures or both for each requesting Client Agency. It is the responsibility of each Contractor to understand and adhere to those policies and procedures prior to any attempt to enter any Client Agency premises for the purpose of carrying out the scope of work described in this Contract.
